

## Mission Statement

The mission of the Music@1st Fine Arts Academy is to provide quality music instruction for children, youth and adults in a welcoming, nurturing environment. Our goal is to help students develop their musical gifts and provide opportunities for them to share their music in recital performances, worship services, and at special outreach events.

The Academy is a non-profit entity which operates under the umbrella of the Plymouth First United Methodist Church music ministry and is part of our connection to the surrounding community.

## Enrollment and Instruction

Private study is offered in piano, voice, guitar, mandolin, ukulele, violin, viola, cello, string bass, electric bass, and other instruments as requested. For the Fall Semester, in person lessons will be offered Tuesday-Wednesday on a weekly basis in 30 and 45 minute blocks. For more advanced students we offer 60 minute lessons.

## End of Semester Recitals

It is important for students to hear other students play. There is also great value in students performing in public. By committing to a semester of study a student is agreeing to attend and perform at the end of semester recitals and should plan to remain for the entire time. Adult students are not required to perform on recitals. Exceptions are at the discretion of the teacher or Academy Director.

# Lessons & Scheduling

To provide consistency and an atmosphere conducive to learning, all Academy lessons are taught at Plymouth First United Methodist Church, Plymouth, MI.

During the enrollment process, each student will be assigned an instructor. The student or parent of the student will then be contacted to confirm a convenient lesson time. Once a lesson time is established please plan to continue through the semester with that time to help us maintain a consistent schedule for all students.

# Make Up Policy

We consider your private lesson time as a standing appointment. If the teacher has to miss a lesson, it will be made up. If the teacher misses other lessons, credit will be issued to the student's account. If the student misses a lesson, 24 hour notice is required, However, if a student wakes up ill on a lesson morning, please CALL THE TEACHER before 9:00 am as messages cannot always be relayed through the church office. Under these circumstances, (with proper prior notice) the teacher will make up ONE lesson per student per semester.

# Weather Cancellation Policy

When Plymouth-Canton Schools are closed due to bad weather conditions, in person lessons are cancelled. Make ups will be scheduled where possible. If not, credit will be issued to the student's account.

### Tuition

Fine Arts Academy tuition covers all lessons. Lesson books and other materials are not covered by tuition. The general cost of books is \$25 per semester.
